The Foundation is currently managed by a fifteen member Board of Directors, who serve three-year terms.





Jody Nichols Newman Outstanding Educational Professional

Jody Nichols Newman served public education from 1959 until her retirement in 1995. Known affectionately as Mrs. Newman by thousands of former students, she was always far more than simply "teacher" to those who knew her. In 1966, after teaching in Raytown and at School of the Osage, Jody became a teacher at Osage Beach Elementary where she demonstrated her unwavering commitment to her students, her community and the district. Whether it was in leadership style, education, or community involvement, she was always ahead of her time. In 1977 Jody became



the Building Principal at Osage Beach Elementary.

During Jody's nearly 20 years as principal at Osage Beach Elementary, she developed and implemented a leadership style (incorporating shared decision making and stakeholder buy-in) long before this style became the norm. She was an instructional leader who always sought consensus and community involvement in decision making. She knew how to grow her staff, students and community and she experienced an exceptional level of trust, faith and support from all with whom she came in contact. She helped staff evaluate, implement and incorporate new instructional approaches and strategies into the classroom. New technologies, programs and ideas were considered in the context of the students' needs.

Believing that a successful school was one that existed to serve its entire community, Jody demonstrated in her own classroom, and was a role model to her staff and families, that Osage Beach Elementary functioned as part of the Lake community. She was considered the cornerstone of the school for 28 years, always providing a positive atmosphere for all students and their families. Her love for children and their education was evident in

each decision she made. Children always came first. Her fellow teachers mirrored this passion, and the student body felt this love and dedication.

Her colleagues respected her leadership style as she crafted and lead an effective, community-centered school. Learning came first, followed closely by truly knowing her students and their families. Jody loved learning, and it showed in all aspects of the school community. Her former students speak fondly of their memories of her and Osage Beach Elementary. They knew she was a strong advocate for not only them, but also for their school.

Jody holds a Bachelor of Science in Education from the University of Missouri as well as a Masters in Curriculum and Instruction, Elementary Education Certification and Principal Certification. She was honored as Teacher of the Year and is a Distinguished Alum of School of the Osage. She is active in the community serving on the Mid-Missouri Mental Health Board, Camden County Library Board, and she currently volunteers at the Miller County Museum and Lake Regional Hospital.

Because of her dedication, leadership, and passion for education, we are pleased to welcome Jody Nichols Newman as the 2014 Hall of Leaders Outstanding Educator Inductee.



Enjoy Your Culinary Experience

Culinary Arts students at the Lake Career & Technical Center have prepared a dinner for the evening built around the fresh flavors of spring. The meal will begin with a "Salad Bar." The Pina Colada Salad is a refreshing combination of romaine lettuce, pineapple, dried cherries, and crisp bacon, drizzled in a coconut dijon emulsion, and topped with toasted macadamia nuts and coconut. It will be accompanied by housemade herbed flatbreads.

For the main course, students have prepared grilled filet mignon and lemon chicken served with a light lemon and white wine sauce. This is accompanied by Smashed Red Potatoes with fresh chives from our garden, and Sauteed Brussels Sprouts, which is part of our Culinary Missouri State Champion menu.

The Foundation Committee selected the dessert to be served tonight from among eight entries presented at a tasting by the Culinary Arts students. The winning dessert is a The Classic French Opera Cake, along with a White Chocolate Mousse Tart with fresh fruits in season, and finished with the prize-winning Salted Caramel Brandy Bonbon. This dessert is a combination of ideas prepared and submitted by Culinary Arts students Logan Blair, Antonio Douglas, Aspin Hill, Phelan Huntsman, Tyler Redman, and Travis Scrivener.

Before the first course, students will shake the "Pina Coladas" in a martini shaker, and turn them out into martini glasses. Students who will be shaking salads are:

Antonio Douglas assisted by Phelan Huntsman Aspin Hill assisted by Paije Rynski Arizbeth Jimenez assisted by Logan Blair

The Culinary Arts Program offers three classes for students. Freshmen and sophomores who want to explore the culinary arts field may enroll in Culinary Careers, a one-hour semester course. This year, the students have learned some of the basics of safety, sanitation, and measuring techniques, as well as various types of careers in the food industry which they displayed in a Career Fair.

Restaurant Skills is a two-hour, year long course for sophomores and juniors who receive a variety of experiences in both the front and back of the house. Students set up the dining room and serve events, as well as do back-up cooking for events, including cake decorating. Their service uniform consists of black pants, white shirt, black bowtie, and black tuxedo apron.

Culinary Arts is the culminating 3-hour, yearlong course, which focuses on cooking principles and techniques in the back-of-the-house. Students may enroll in this course for two years. This year, there are thirteen first-year students and six returning second-year students who have prepared and served around 40 events for anywhere from 5 to 500 guests. Their uniforms consist of black and white checked pants (which designate a culinary student) and chef coats. Students with white coats and white toques (hats) are first-year students in the class, and those with black coats and black toques are second-year students who work on advanced skills and serve as mentors to the first-year students.

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
