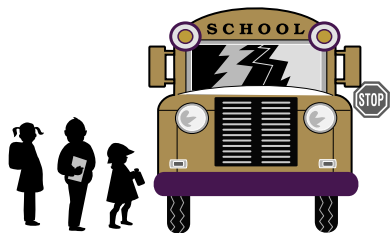

## There are five elementary locations:

► Elementary attendance centers are located in the Camdenton, Osage Beach, and Sunrise Beach areas. Generally, students in grades Pre-K-4 living north of the Hurricane Deck Bridge attend the Hurricane Deck Elementary School. Students in grades Pre-K-4 on State Road KK and east attend the Osage Beach Elementary School. All students in grades 5-12 attend school on the main campus in Camdenton.

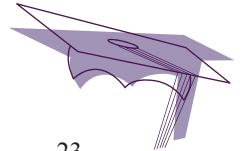
